

Heritage and history

Eye was an island surrounded by marshland until the fens were drained in the 17th century. At nearby Flag Fen there is evidence people have been in the area since 2000BC. To the west of Eye runs Car Dyke, an 85 mile ditch built by the Romans in the second century AD, the current church was built in 1846 and there was once an eight sail windmill to the east of the village,

In 1866 the station and railway line to Wisbech, Sutton Bridge and Kings Lynn that was later to become part of the Midland and Great Northern (M&GN) opened to the north of the village. It was constructed to tap into the large fruit, flower and vegetable traffic of north Cambridgeshire and Norfolk. It stayed open nearly 100 years but was sadly closed in the 1960s. The Eye bypass which opened in 1991 runs along the much of the line of the old track.

Quarrying of the clay for bricks began at the end of the 19th century and continued until the 1980's, the chimneys for the kilns towered over the village. The clay was laid down over 150 million years ago. Gravel which was laid down at the end of the last ice age is still quarried in Eye for the construction industry.

Eye was part of Northamptonshire until 1965 when it became part of Hutingdonshire. As part of the Local Government Act 1972 this then became a district of Cambridgeshire.

Welcome

Eye, Cambridgeshire sits on the edge of the fens, surrounded by rich agricultural land with the city of Peterborough to the west and the town of Crowland with its historical abbey to the north. The first known written mention of the village is in the Saxon Chronicles in AD 963 the name originating from the Anglo-Saxon word "Teg", meaning island.

Eye is a large village with a community of over 4500 people. There are numerous organisations and community groups. From judo to dancing, tennis to indoor bowls, bingo to weight watchers, there should be something for everyone.

There are more than 50 businesses in Eye spread across the village. The retail concerns include a bakery, butchers, general store, a number of hairdressers, pharmacy, post office and restaurants.

If a gentle stroll is all you need then take a walk around the Eye Green Nature Reserve, or maybe you want to take a cycle ride along part of the Green Wheel to the north or south of the village. But don't forget those cycle helmets! On those hot summer days you may want to pop into the local store for an ice cream or chill out with a cold drink in the local pub.

There are two nature reserves in the village, Eye Green to the east and Star Pit, a site of specific scientific interest, to the west which is managed by the Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire and Northamptonshire Wildlife Trust.
